During the regular session, Representative Bonnen authored House Bill 2063, a bill that would require patient or surrogate consent before a physician can issue a Do-Not-Resuscitate (DNR) Order. House leadership killed House Bill 2063 with calendar games. During the special session, Dr. Bonnen worked tirelessly with stakeholders, staff, his fellow legislators, and the Governor's office to build consensus and lead the bill to passage. Representative Greg Bonnen is one of Texas Right to Life's 2017 Pro-Life Heroes.
